Lots to Celebrate in 2019



Sometimes I hear people say that nothing new ever happens in Pendleton, and my response is "just open your eyes!"

In 2019 alone, we can celebrate the opening of the new State Police Crime Lab, an important project that all of our regional law enforcement officials have been working on for several years. A new cancer center is under construction near St. Anthony Hospital. We just celebrated the opening of a modern, more capable fire station that will serve the city for many decades to come. Parks and Recreation built three new playgrounds in our parks.

It was a great year for grants.

From the Legislature we got \$13 million to build the BMCC large animal science facility (FARM II) and another \$1.6 million to renovate the County Jail. The Economic Development Administration awarded Pendleton a huge \$3 million grant to upgrade the infrastructure at the regional airport and the FAA is spending nearly \$6 million to repave the main runway. Another \$600,000 in grants helped us renovate the large "B-17" hangar at the airport and make it a home for PAE-ISR, a large defense contractor client at the UAS test range. From FEMA, we got \$290,000 to fund a volunteer/ Reserve firefighter coordinator position for three years and they also gave us \$36,000 for a new exhaust system for fire station #2. The Pendleton Police Department got a \$31,000 grant for body cameras.

To cap it all off, in 2019 the *Oregonian* newspaper named Pendleton as the Safest City in Oregon for cities larger than 10,000 residents.

While the projects didn't happen in 2019, we can still point with pride at the new schools recently constructed by the Pendleton School District and the new buildings and programs made possible by bonds for BMCC.

Next on the agenda:

Fixing our streets to where they are in good condition and less expensive to permanently maintain. More on that in December!

Council Member Corner

As a Pendleton City Councilor I serve as a liaison to several commissions. Today, I would like to give a brief summary of the progress our Parks and Recreation Commission made since the relatively new Parks and Recreation Director Liam Hughes came to us in 2018 from Sisters, Oregon.

Our Parks and Recreation Department is divided into 4 main subdivisions: Olney Cemetery, Public Parks, Recreation Center and Aquatic Center. Of them, the only one not relying primarily upon Pendleton's general fund budget for subsistence is the Pendleton Aquatic Center. The cemetery, recreation center and parks department rely on tax payer dollars for the majority of their funding.

Under the leadership of Liam Hughes the cemetery and recreation center will be enabled to recover more dollars through user fees (e.g. expanded options at Olney Cemetery), grants, and scholarship donations and there by decrease their reliance upon taxpayer dollars from the city's general fund budget. An example includes the newly installed playground equipment at several city parks this past year, the major portion of funding coming from state lottery dollars, Wildhorse Foundation, and Pendleton Foundation Trust.

Another recent development is the recreation department's after school program, spearheaded by Jon Bullard which has taken off to a great start, thanks in large part to collaboration from the school district and local fundraising efforts to aid low income families to enroll their children in this worthwhile program.

My next update will include information from my liaison role with the Pendleton Convention Center Commission.



volunteers that teamed up with City recreation staff. It was estimated over 900 community members came to enjoy games and snacks.


