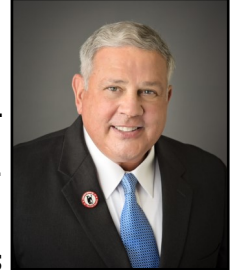

A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Budget 101

On May 9th, the City Budget Committee finished its annual chore of approving the budgets for both the City and the Pendleton Development Commission (our urban renewal organization). I expect this budget will be formally adopted by the City Council during June. As usual, there was not enough money to do everything we want to do, but there won't be any significant cuts to services either. The biggest challenge to the City in this coming year's budget is paying for more than \$500,000 in new PERS costs. This is a half-million that won't get spent on roads, social services, or public safety. When people complain that the cost of government seems to keep going up, they should be aware that paying for PERS is one of the primary culprits.



There are some large capital projects scheduled for the coming year. The City has increased its spending on street repairs to \$1.2 million, which is about \$300,000 more than we are spending in the current fiscal year. The amount we need to spend on the streets each year if we want to actually fix the problem is \$2.2 million. We have received assurances from the EDA that our \$3 million grant for airport infrastructure will be approved soon. Since it is a grant specifically for the airport, those funds can't be used for street repairs. Other dollars from the water fund will be spent at the airport on water projects that are necessary to provide adequate pressure to fight fires and expand the airport infrastructure. The FAA is also going to spend about \$6 million to resurface the main runway. Those dollars must be spent on that specific project. The 8th Street Bridge will be completed in the coming fiscal year. A new after-school program will be started by the Parks and Rec Department and user fees will pay for it.

Sometimes letters to the EO show that a few citizens don't really understand how the budget works, what makes up the 32 different funds in the budget, and the restrictions most of those funds have. For example, one person wrote in April that if the City had used the funds from the Airport Road project we could have fixed our streets for 10 years or more. Not really. That capital project used \$6 million in Federal dollars that were not allocated for street repairs. Voters added another \$1.5 million dollars from a gas tax that no longer exists. Ten years of street repairs are going to cost about \$22 million. Another person appeared in front of the Council and said that if we would just put a two-dollar surcharge on each Round-Up ticket, we would have more than enough money to fix our streets. Wrong, again. This plan might generate \$150,000 each year which is just a fraction of the true cost of street repair. Other ideas sometimes advocate using Pendleton Development Commission funds for projects outside the urban renewal zone, which is not legal. The City of Pendleton just completed its budget meetings, there were four meetings this year, all advertised in the EO and online. We encourage those who wish to learn more and gain better understanding of our budget process to attend meetings, and ask the questions.

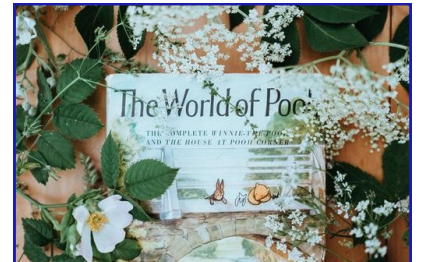
Come get your wiggle on with Miss Angel as she leads a fun movement based story time. Children will end this class by creating their own movement storybook.

MEMORIAL BENCHES

PARK SHELTER RESERVATIONS

Park shelters can be used without a reservation, but paid reservations take precedence. If it absolutely must be available for your event you'll want to [reserve online](#) or contact the Parks Office, 865 Tutuilla Road, 541-276-8100.

If you are planning a park wedding, parks are open to all as public spaces. However, we recommend that you consider reserving the nearest shelter to ensure privacy during your ceremony.

Fees

- **Shelters:** \$29 for the first two hours (\$17 rental fee + \$6/hour + 2 hour minimum = \$29) and \$6 for each additional hour.
- **Additional picnic tables** (up to four tables max and must be included and paid for with your reservation): \$30
- **Park Bag** (free with shelter reservation), includes volleyball, net, horseshoes, and more: \$6

Park Shelter Cancellation Policy

If cancellation notice is received 7 or more calendar days before the reservation date, a full refund will be given. If cancellation notice is given less than 7 calendar days before the event, your payment will be applied toward a future park shelter reservation within the same calendar year.
