


A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

NEWS FROM THE AIRPORT

In spite of the fears and criticisms of early nay-sayers, the Airport and the Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) Test Range are outpacing all expectations. Here are some facts:





We got a grant to put a new roof on the large "B-17" hangar next to the terminal and PAE/ISR is leasing it from the City for an attractive price. PAE recently got a major contract with NASA to work on integrating UAS into the national airspace, so Pendleton will see a lot of traffic from NASA's aerospace engineers in the next couple of years.

The City bought a hangar from the Hart estate in October and it is filled with a customer with a lease that will pay off the City's investment in less than three years.

We expect to get a \$3 million EDA grant in the near future and we will use that money to build more hangars and offices. We already have customers who have indicated a desire to fill those buildings as soon as they are ready.

We began operations in 2015. That year we had \$0 in contracted revenue and less than 10 UAS operations. So far, in the first 10 months of 2018, we have:

More than 2,200 UAS operations 10 core customers 50,000+ square feet of space leased More than 30 good paying jobs created, growing monthly Conservatively estimated \$650,000 in contracted revenues

Just as important are the non-UAS jobs created in the hotel, restaurant, catering, entertainment, and retail industries that support the many transient UAS test personnel who come to Pendleton to work.

So many UAS workers are coming to Pendleton that our shortage of housing is becoming an issue for the test range. The City is working with developers to try to get more apartments and homes built. Hopefully my next column will talk about some progress we are expecting in meeting the housing challenge.

BUSINESS LICENSE

All businesses within the city limits of Pendleton must obtain a city business license. Even if your business office is located outside the city limits and you only do business occasionally in Pendleton, you still need a city business license.

An application form for a city business license may be obtained at Pendleton City Hall or by downloading the <u>business</u> <u>license application</u> in PDF format. Businesses are required to reapply for business licenses annually. Renewal forms can also be obtained at Pendleton City Hall or by downloading the <u>business license renewal application</u>.

SPECIAL EVENT BUSINESS LICENSES

All vendors must obtain a Special Event Business License in order to operate during the various special events held in the City of Pendleton (Round-Up, Whisky Fest, Bike Week, etc.). An application form for a Special Business License may be obtained at Pendleton City Hall or by downloading the <u>Special Event Business License application</u> in PDF format. There are a few exceptions listed below:

- Non-profit corporations within the Happy Canyon and Round-Up grounds are not required to obtain a Round-Up business license.
- Indian Village crafts show participants are not required to obtain a Round-Up business license.
- Vendors and performers operating as a part of the Main Street Show from the Friday before Round-Up each year and ending the Sunday after Round-Up are not required to obtain a business license. The Main Street Show License, obtained by the Main Street Cowboys, operates in lieu of another business license.

DOG LICENSES

A dog license is required for all dogs over the age of six months, living within the city limits of Pendleton unless specifically exempt. It is the duty of each owner or keeper of a dog to obtain a license(s) for their dog(s). The initial licensing of a dog must be accomplished within fourteen days of the date of acquiring a dog by a City resident or moving a dog into the City. The Licenses must be renewed annually on or before the first day of each year.

To get a city dog license, your dog must be currently inoculated with a rabies vaccination. The vaccination needs to be updated every one or three years, depending on the type of vaccination given. A dog license may be purchased for up to three years through the year the rabies vaccination expires. Keeping your animals current on their vaccinations prevents the contraction and the spread of various diseases.

EXEMPTIONS FROM DOG LICENSES:

- Dogs owned by dealers, breeders or exhibitors which are kept in kennels exclusively for sale or exhibition.
- Guide dogs when owned and kept as an aid to a blind person.
- Any dog under the supervision of its owner of manager which is actively engaged in the herding or control of livestock is exempt while engaged in such activity.
- Dogs less than six (6) months old.

An Application for a dog license may be obtained at Pendleton City Hall or by downloading the <u>dog license</u> in PDF format. An application needs to be filled out for each dog being licensed.

NEED A RIDE TO THE STORE? WORK? BASEBALL PRACTICE? COLLEGE? AUTO REPAIR? WE'VE GOT OPTIONS FOR YOU!

The City of Pendleton transportation programs consist of senior/disabled taxi tickets, general public taxi tickets, senior meal site transportation, a daily van service serving the general public, parks and recreation summer interpark rides, and an aquatic center summer transport. The City contracts with Elite Taxis, Inc. for these services.

LET'ER BUS TRANSIT

The City of Pendleton is introducing the new deviated fixed route service, called "Let'er Bus Transit". This bus route is for the general public, all are welcome to ride under the following guidelines. The routes began on October 15th and will run two different routes, six times a day. The routes will not operate on federal holidays.

The North-East route will run from Walmart out to Riverside and back through the North Hill neighborhood. Stops on the North-East route will include City Hall, Main Street, state offices on Emigrant, the high school and BMCC. The South-West route will run from

Walmart south through the McKay, Sherwood and South Hill neighborhoods. Stops will include St. Anthony hospital, Southgate Medical Center and the St. Anthony's physical therapy office.



Please see the route map and bus stop times on our website. Each one way ride will cost \$1. Exact fare is requested as drivers may not have access to change. Route deviation requests up to half a mile off the route and "Flag Stops" require a 24 hour advance phone notice Monday through Friday during open dispatch hours. ("Flag Stops" are designated stops that are not stopped at daily without an advance notice request. Flag stops include the Airport and Grecian Heights.) The dispatch phone line number is 541-276-6476 and is available between 8 am and 5 pm Monday through Friday.

Riders must be at least 9 years old to ride alone. Riders age 8 and younger can ride free but must be accompanied with a paid fare older companion rider. Intoxicated riders will not be allowed to board the bus for the safety of others. The bus is ADA compliant for wheelchair service and a bike rack is available for the bike rider to load their own bike. Bus riders must be able to keep personal belongings out of the bus aisle and within their own seat space.



PENDLETON IS EAGER TO HELP YOUR BUSINESS THRIVE!



Our downtown urban renewal program provides financial and consulting support, whether you're starting a business, expanding your business or getting a building ready for business. Downtown includes a wide swath of Pendleton running along the Umatilla River. Businesses locating or already located within the downtown urban renewal area are eligible to apply for help.

Check out these five programs to help your business in the Pendleton Urban Renewal District. Keep in mind that you might be able to use multiple programs to get maximum financial support for your project.

Jump-Start

The Jump-Start program provides many benefits including free business consulting and low-cost loans beginning as low as 1%. Benefits are available for both building owners and new or existing business owners/operators.

Façade Restoration

If you own a building or plan to buy one for your business, the Façade Restoration program could provide you with grants—that's right, no repayment necessary. Grants in this program can be used to restore or upgrade the exterior of your building. Projects can be as simple as a paint job or complex as a complete façade renovation.

Fresh Start

The Fresh Start program provides a financial incentive to build commercial structures within the Pendleton Urban Renewal District. It is intended to provide business people with an incentive to build in Pendleton, providing a boost to the city's economic development.

Demolition

Let's say you buy a failing building that's not restorable. You just want to demolish and re-build. We've got financial help for your demolition project.

Upper Story and Elevator Programs

Do you own a building in Pendleton's downtown urban renewal district but can't fully utilize the upper floors? Grants are available for second story renovation.

Permit Fee Reimbursement

You may be reimbursed for the cost of permits needed to remodel or redevelop a building in the urban renewal area for a business use. City permit fees for your project will be reimbursed up to 100% when your project is completed, up to \$2,000.
