A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Competitive Advantages



Businesses and even cities try to find something they can promote or sell in which their competitive advantage provides a greater return on investment. Pendleton has a competitive advantage when it comes to tourism. As you read this column, we will be wrapping up “*Pendleton Bike Week*”, sponsored by Indian Motorcycles. This follows directly on the heels of the highly successful “*Pendleton Whisky Music Fest*” where some 18,500 people gathered in the Round-Up grounds to sway to the music of Pitbull, Blake Shelton, and other artists.

Why did these two great events come to Pendleton? Well, the first answer is because many dedicated and resourceful citizens spent a lot of initiative, time, and effort to organize the events. Doug Corey told me they had some 900 employees and volunteers enlisted just to make the *Music Fest* work. This included everyone from ticket sellers to security to beverage servers and stage hands.

The second answer is that Pendleton has the capacity to host large events. The Round-Up Directors recognized this capacity about ten years ago and later hired Casey Beard as the first general manager of the Round-Up. In addition to helping make the Round-Up run more smoothly, he helps coordinate new events like the *Music Fest* and a new motorcycle flat track race, both of which take place in the Round-Up grounds. Largely due to the annual Round-Up, Pendleton has far more hotel rooms and restaurants than you might typically find in a city this size, and this gives us unusual capacity to host large conferences, festivals, and conventions. The Convention Center and the nearby Wildhorse Resort and Casino certainly help make Pendleton more attractive to large groups.

Besides the obvious direct economic benefits of large tourism events, there are more subtle benefits included. Because of the Round-Up, the Woolen Mills, Hamley’s, Severe saddles, or even a brand of whisky, just about everyone in the Pacific Northwest has heard of Pendleton. Dozens of college bound students from Pendleton receive scholarships paid for by organizations that park cars or serve concessions at these large events. Many of our elected officials at the state and federal levels come to Pendleton to be seen in the *Westward Ho!* parade. This allows Pendleton far more recognition in Salem or Washington D.C. that we might otherwise have.

Next time our streets are clogged with visitors and you have trouble getting a seat in your favorite restaurant, please try to remember the many benefits tourism brings to our beautiful city.

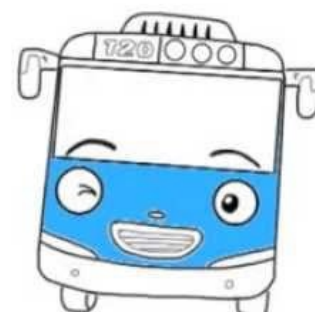

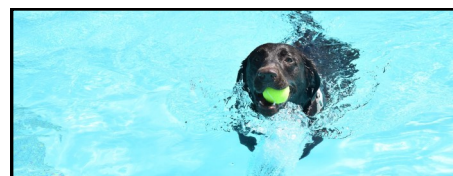

HEAT EXHAUSTION OR HEAT STROKE?

HEAT EXHAUSTION SYMPTOMS

1. Faint or dizzy
2. Excessive sweating
3. Cool, pale, clammy skin
4. Nausea, vomiting
5. Rapid, weak pulse
6. Muscle cramps

HOW TO TREAT IT

1. Move to cooler location
2. Drink water
3. Take a cool shower or use cold compresses



HEAT STROKE SYMPTOMS

1. Throbbing headache
2. No sweating
3. Body temp above 103°
Red, hot, dry skin
4. Nausea, vomiting
5. Rapid, strong pulse
6. May lose consciousness

HOW TO TREAT IT

1. Get emergency help
2. Keep cool until treated

Protect All the Skin You're In

- Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States, yet most skin cancers can be prevented.
- Every year, there are 63,000 new cases of and 9,000 deaths from melanoma—the deadliest form of skin cancer.

Ultraviolet (UV) exposure is the most common cause of skin cancer. A new CDC study shows that the majority of Americans are not using sunscreen regularly to protect themselves from the sun's harmful UV rays.

In fact, fewer than 35% of men and fewer than 30% of women reported using sunscreen regularly on their face and other exposed skin when outside for more than 1 hour.

Many women report that they regularly use sunscreen on their faces but not on other exposed skin.

Choose sun protection strategies that work.

Use broad spectrum sunscreen with SPF 15+ to protect any exposed skin.



Seek shade, especially during midday hours.

Wear a hat, sunglasses and other clothes to protect skin.



Sunscreen works best when used with shade or clothes, and it must be re-applied every two hours and after swimming, sweating, and toweling off.

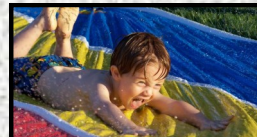

Walk, Ride, Play

For its size, Pendleton has a remarkable number of recreation opportunities, as well as excellent facilities that support an active lifestyle and provide social gathering places for the community.

WALK

- Over 3 miles of trails within City parks; terrain varies by location.
- The non-motorized River Parkway offers another 3 miles along the Umatilla River
- We also recommend the 50-acre Olney Cemetery, which has miles of loops that make for excellent walking with 150' of elevation change from bottom to top.
- We have an indoor walking program October through July in the Helen McCune Gymnasium at the Pendleton Rec Center.

RIDE

The Pendleton Adventure Trails Recreation Area (PATRA) contains 8 trails. The trails are made and maintained by volunteers from Pendleton on Wheels. For a map of the trails, please visit the [Trail Forks website](#). The non-motorized [River Parkway](#) is as popular with bicyclists as it is with walkers.



- Pendleton also has a system of bike lanes and routes throughout town. On our maps page you can view the Parks & Rec brochure or just a map of existing bicycle facilities.

PENDLETON FIRE

The Pendleton Fire Department received a federal grant award this month of \$36,364 for the assistance in purchasing a source capture exhaust system (SCES) for Fire Station #2. This system will capture the exhaust produced by fire apparatus as they pull out and are backed into the fire station, thus eliminating the exposure to noxious gases and carcinogens at station #2. This system is the most effective way to reduce these hazards to the areas in which firefighters' work, eat and sleep.

The city will have a share of \$3,636 in the completion of the project. The fire department has done preliminary bids for the purchase and install of the project during the grant request phase and will be moving quickly to secure a vendor and start the project.

The fire department is very thankful for the support we have received from all our elected officials at both the local and federal levels of government. Their unanimous support of this project has been instrumental in the successful award of this grant.



PENDLETON POLICE

The Pendleton Public Library is partnering with the Pendleton Police Department in this year's National Night out event by offering to one lucky registered party a "Campfire Stories" presentation. We will hold a drawing prior to August 7th and to the winning group will see the Library attend with a special campground themed story time along with fun activities for families to try, such as: a giant parachute, tug of war rope, and sack race bags. We continue to gain sponsors and goodies, so other drawings may be made possible as we get closer to event night.

In addition, we are hosting a Coloring Contest for kids 3-12 years old. Coloring sheets can be found at various venues around town to be returned to the library or the Police Department before August 1st for judging. "America's Night Out Against Crime"

Neighborhoods throughout Pendleton are invited to join over 38 million neighbors across approximately 16 thousand communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, and military bases worldwide on **August 7th, 2018**, the first Tuesday of August, for National Night Out. National Night Out is nationally sponsored by National Association of Town Watch (NATW), Dietz and Watson, Ring, Package Guard, and co-sponsored locally by The Pendleton Police Department.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live. Together, we are making that happen.

In years past, the Pendleton Police Department has hosted National Night Out parties at local venues. This year, we are moving this community event back into the community and into your neighborhood. From 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on August 7th, neighbors throughout Pendleton and across the nation are asked to lock their doors, turn on their front porch lights, and spend the evening outside with neighbors and law enforcement.

As National Night Out also coincides with the regularly scheduled Pendleton City Council meeting, this year, with the cooperation of Pendleton Mayor John Turner, the Pendleton City Council Meeting will take place the following Tuesday so that City Council Members may participate in this event in their various wards and neighborhoods.

Pendleton Police Department is grateful for help from our many community partners, which include Hill Meat, Franz Bakery, Walmart, Safeway, Pendleton Parks and Recreation, the City of Pendleton Library, Pendleton City Council and Mayor Turner, as well as many other agencies, businesses, and support entities who help make this an amazing night for our community.

To help you in planning your Pendleton National Night Out event, the Pendleton Police and Pendleton Parks and Recreation Departments are coordinating to provide locations at City Parks to hold your neighborhood party. The Pendleton Aquatic Center, a division of Parks and Rec, is also donating free day passes to the PAC for those organizing a party. These passes are to be given to your party attendees, but cannot be raffled or sold. In addition, Hill Meat, Franz Bakery, and other local sponsors are working with PPD to provide some supplies for your party! Pendleton Police and our many community partners will also be assisting with various activities at community party sites on this night.

Additionally, plans are in the works for a Coloring Contest, as are presentations at registered parties, co-sponsored by the Pendleton City Library, Pendleton Fire Department, and other community partners.

Following receipt of the registration form, registrants will receive a PPD-NNO Party Pack Voucher which can be redeemed prior to the event for hotdogs, buns, and other party goodies.
