A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Looking Towards the Future

It is budget time again and our Department Heads are in the process of sharpening their pencils and trying to determine how they can provide high quality services with limited resources. While we continuously search for new sources of revenue, we are always facing the rising costs of doing business. The gorilla in the room is PERS. We estimate that the City of Pendleton will have to contribute about \$400,000 more to PERS in the coming fiscal year 2020 (above what we currently spend). I am not worried about the budget for next year, but your City Council has begun discussions about what our budget may look like 3-5 years down the road.



Oregon budget laws require us to be conservative in our estimates of new revenues, and this means we can't rely on overly generous estimates of new sources of money. We know we will get more money from marijuana taxes, and you have probably heard that the Council wants at least half of those dollars to go into fixing our streets. We also know that we will get more money from property taxes and we anticipate more revenues from the UAS Test Range. The problem is that the costs of PERS, asphalt, building repairs, personnel, and vehicle repairs rise faster than our known sources of revenue.

The City Council wants to be prudent by looking for new revenues now, and by controlling expenses now so that we don't face a crisis in a few years. Don't be alarmed by these ongoing discussions, because this is merely a responsible exercise in good government.

Our efforts to increase housing units should pay off in three ways: more property taxes, a larger workforce, and more kids in our school district. We are starting to see some encouraging signs that investors and housing developers are getting interested in Pendleton. When the Pendleton Development Commission (our urban renewal agency) expires in 2023, several hundred thousands of property tax dollars will become available for our City budget.

I remain confident and optimistic about the future of our City. A lot of dedicated people, many of them volunteers, are working hard to make sure we continue to enjoy a high quality of life. A recent example of this is our designation as a "Tree City USA", mainly as a result of the work done by our Tree Commission. The recent "Dancing with the Pendleton Stars" event raised thousands of dollars for several worthwhile charitable organizations. If you want to sit in on our workshops when we discuss the budget and our future, you are very welcome. If you have ideas on how we might develop new resources, please share them. Our City works well because of our citizens. Thank you!

NOTICE OF BUDGET COMMITTEE MEETING

Public meetings of the Budget Committee of the City of Pendleton, to discuss the budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 will be held at the Vert Club Room, City Hall complex, SW $4^{\rm th}$ Street entrance, Pendleton, Oregon.

The first meeting will take place on May 1, 2018 at 7:00 a.m. The purpose of this meeting is to receive the budget message and to receive comment from the public on the budget. Consideration will be given to possible uses of State Revenue Sharing Funds. This is a public meeting where deliberation of the Budget Committee will take place. Any person may appear at this meeting and discuss the proposed programs with the Budget Committee. A copy of the preliminary budget document may be inspected or obtained on or after April 23rd between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday at City Hall, 500 SW Dorion Ave. or on the City's website at www.pendleton.or.us under Finance Department. This budget notice is also posted on the City's website.

Additional Budget Committee meetings will be held on May 3rd at 6 pm, and May 8, & 10, 2018 at 7 am (May 11 if necessary.) All meetings will be held at the Vert Club Room.

LICENSES

Dog Licenses – The City requires that dog owners obtain a license for pets over 6 months in age. As a public health measure, the license may be used until the dog's vaccinations expire at which point the owner must renew the license and present proof that the dog's vaccines have been updated. <u>Click here</u> for more information and to download a license application/renewal. Business Licenses – The City requires that businesses obtain a license to operate in Pendleton, including businesses operating out of a temporary location during special events. 



Call if you can, text if you can't: Dispatch centers for Umatilla County and Milton-Freewater are now able to accept Text-to-911 messages to report emergencies. When texting 911 for an emergency, include the city and location of where it is taking place, and what type of help is needed — whether it is police, fire or medical.

Photos, videos and emojis cannot be sent to 911, and trying to send them will corrupt the call

NEW ONLINE PAYMENT OPTIONS

Previously the City had a charge of \$1.25 when a customer made a utility payment online. Recently the City has agreed to absorb the cost and make online bill pay FREE.






Utility customers can now set up credit card autopay's online through the system or if they want to use their checking account they can come in to the counter and we can help them set up the account to automatically be deducted monthly.

Here's an awesome feature! With our online system you can view your payment and consumption history any time by logging-in to your account.

USING YOUR LIBRARY CARD CAN SAVE YOU MONEY

When you check out a book at the Pendleton Public Library, at the bottom of your check out slip, there is information sharing with you how much you saved by checking out the book as opposed to purchasing the book.

According to Google, if your book is a 375-page novel, it's reasonable to ask \$16.95 for it. Most average-sized trade paperback novels fall into the \$13.95 to \$17.95 price range. That being said, this range is true for most books.

Street Lights


If you would like to report a street light outage, you may do so by filing a report here on the City's website, or at the Building Department at City Hall.
