



A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

LOOKING BACK ON 2017

I have a hard time believing that 2017 has passed by so quickly! A lot of things have happened and I think it is productive to review some of the issues and progress we, as a City, have made in the past year.





that we have a plan in place to replace them and we have money to do it. The City has a \$14.8 million line of credit at 1.4 % interest, and we have enough revenues coming in to service our loans. This money will be used in the next five years to put in new water lines. Once the water lines have been replaced, we will start fixing the streets above them. All of this seems to take much longer than we would like, but we are making progress. We are still not putting enough money into paving our streets, and the City Council has made it a priority to make better progress in this area.

Fire Station- Thanks to the support of our voters, we have the resources to build a new fire station and buy much needed safety equipment. Design of the station is underway, and McCormack Construction is the general contractor. Ground breaking is scheduled for the summer of 2018 with completion of the building scheduled for the summer of 2019. Thanks to a premium on the bond sale, we got about \$10 million in revenue for about \$9 million in actual debt, saving our taxpayers nearly one million dollars.

After operating for years in the red, the airport and test range are now making a profit. Boutique Airlines is booking customers at a rate that matches what we had ten years ago. We have enough customers wanting to use the test range that we are exploring ways to build more hangars and improve the facilities. More potential customers talk to us every month. We purchased the Community Bank building and it is now producing a profit as the innovation/ command and control center. We have applied for federal grants to improve the range and are looking at ways to reduce the airport's debt to the City. The Governor even mentioned the Pendleton UAV test range as a bright spot in the State's economy in her annual address to the Business Summit this month.

Tourism- 2017 was a great year for tourism, with the Pendleton Whisky Music Fest, the Harley Davidson Bike Week, and of course the Round-Up. Pat Beard is doing a nice job in modernizing our Convention Center and booking new events. Harley Davidson will sponsor Bike Week again in 2018, and the Round-Up and Happy Canyon have strong ticket sales and revenues. Congratulations to the Round-Up for winning the PRCA's "**Best Large Outdoor Rodeo**" for the third year in a row! I am looking forward to finding out who will be the headliner for the Whisky Fest next year.

Housing- This is one of the City's top four goals and we want to add at least 50 new housing units (including apartments) each year. I think we will do this in 2018. There is a lot of construction going on.

Of course we don't have sufficient resources to solve all of our problems in one year. We do have specific goals and we have measures of effectiveness that will tell us if we are making progress. I want to thank all of our City employees for accomplishing so much with what we have. We are lucky to live in special place where crime is low, schools are good, traffic is light, people are friendly and the future is bright.

The Eastern Oregon Regional Airport is the largest public airport in Northeast Oregon (east of Portland). This city-owned airport in located three miles northwest of Pendleton, Oregon. The airport covers 2,273 acres at an elevation of 1,497 feet above sea level. The airport, open 24 hours/day, is centrally located between Portland, Spokane, Boise, Salt Lake City, and Seattle.

Boutique Air provides 3 round trip flights from Pendleton (PDT) to Portland (PDX) per day, 7 days a week.


