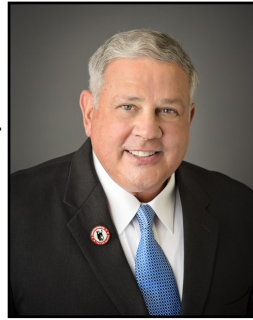

A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

The End is Near!

As I write this, I am preparing to participate in several ceremonies for our Veterans. On Thursday, 9 November, there is a ceremony for the Military Order of the Purple Heart out at the CTUIR July Grounds, followed by a parade and luncheon in the Long House. On Friday, 10 November, Gail and I will hold our annual party celebrating the birth of the U.S. Marine Corps in 1775. On Saturday, 11 November, the VFW will host its annual Veteran's Day ceremonies at both Olney Cemetery and at the Pioneer Chapel. The Eastern Oregon Regional Airport is the largest public airport in Northeast Oregon (east of Portland). This city-owned airport is located three miles northwest of Pendleton, Oregon. The airport covers 2,273 acres at an elevation of 1,497 feet above sea level. The airport, open 24 hours/day, is centrally located between Portland, Spokane, Boise, Salt Lake City, and Seattle.

WINTER IS COMING

With Thanksgiving on it's way and winter quickly following, here are a few tips for those who will be traveling.

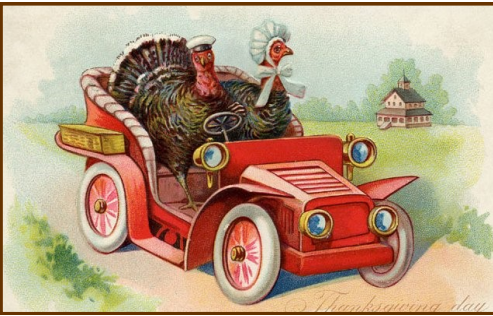
When planning travel, be aware of current and forecast weather conditions.

Avoid traveling when the weather service has issued advisories.

If you must travel, inform a friend or relative of your proposed route and expected time of arrival.

Follow these safety rules if you become stranded in your car.

- Stay with your car unless safety is no more than 100 yards away, but continue to move arms and legs.
- Stay visible by putting bright cloth on the antenna, turning on the inside overhead light (when engine is running), and raising the hood when snow stops falling.
- Run the engine and heater only 10 minutes every hour.
- Keep a downwind window open.
- Make sure the tailpipe is not blocked.



Winter Reminder Check on family and neighbors who are especially at risk from cold weather hazards: young children, older adults, and the chronically ill. If you have pets, bring them inside. If you cannot bring them inside, provide adequate, warm shelter and unfrozen water to drink.

If you follow these suggestions, you will be ready for it when it comes.
