A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Help Tell Our Story

About a year ago, the City was discussing how to best communicate with the public. One idea was to hire a Public Information Officer (PIO), but we decided not to add more staff. Instead, we are trying to do a better job of communicating using



the resources we have. This includes everyone on the City staff.

You see, our staff you are aware of a lot of great things that are happening in our city, such as construction contracts being awarded, recreational programs being offered, or the opening of a new business. We need to tell our friends and neighbors about the many good things that are taking place in our town.

We should reassure them that we have a plan to fix our aging infrastructure, that we live in a safe community, that we are actively seeking to attract more tourists, that we are making progress on more housing, and that we continuously look for more state or grant dollars for our projects.

Another way the Council wants to communicate is by sending out teams to visit our service organizations, the Chamber of Commerce, and the many commissions, committees, and boards that meet monthly to support our City. When we talk to these groups, we can tell them about how we are measuring our progress towards our top four goals (so they know we are keeping our eyes on meeting our goals) and we can answer their questions. My experience is that you can never tell your story too often. We expect to start this in January.

DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME

Sunday, November 5, 2017, marks the end of Daylight Saving Time — you will be turning your clocks back one

hour. A good rule of thumb to remember "falling back."

This is also a great time to check your smoke detectors batteries.



WINTER IS COMING



Check your battery. Cold weather is tough on your car's battery.

Change your wiper blades and refill your wiper fluid. You need to see the road to drive safely, but the build-up of winter precipitation and salt on your windshield can greatly reduce visibility.

Consider getting snow tires. If you live in an area that's covered with snow for most of the winter, you should swap your regular all-season tires out for snow tires.

Check your tire pressure. If you don't replace your regular tires with snow tires, at least keep them properly inflated during the winter.

Check your four-wheel drive. Four -wheel drive can provide better traction when driving on snowy and icy roads.

Check your anti-freeze mixture. The mixture of anti-freeze and water in your radiator should be about 50:50.

Stock your car with emergency supplies. You never know when you'll get stranded on the side of the road.

Change the oil and adjust the viscosity. In order for your engine to run, it needs proper lubrication from oil.

Check your belts and hoses. Cold temps can weaken the belts and hoses that help make your engine run.

Research shows that the benefits of volunteering are endless for people of any age. Volunteers are likely to feel more connected to their community, increase their self-esteem, and gain job skills. For teenagers, volunteering has an added bonus: it looks great on college applications and creates eligibility to apply for certain scholarships that help pay for higher education. Admissions officers and philanthropists want well rounded students who

volunteer: after GPA and test scores service work is a leading decision



making factor. Volunteering is a testament to character that no standardized test score can duplicate. It also creates a topic of interest for essays. By engaging in volunteer works, teens also have an opportunity to learn experientially, explore their interests, and define possible career paths, helping them make more informed

choices about college and career options as well as instilling a lifelong interest in giving back.


