



#### A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

#### "Before Round-Up"

The folks from Montana like to say they have two seasons: Winter and the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. In Pendleton, we like to say we have two seasons: Before and After Round-Up.



There is evidence that more housing is on the way. Dusty Pace has agreed to buy all of the remaining Sunridge properties from the City and he has plans to build 10-12 houses per year on more than 40 lots. Work should commence soon on more apartments at Pendleton Heights by Olney Cemetery. We recently had a pre-design meeting with some folks who plan to build apartments next to Roosters restaurant. Construction has begun on some new duplex townhouses on SW 12<sup>th</sup> Street and a property owner has shown interest in building some duplexes in the vicinity of Juniper House.

You may have noticed that the City sold the bonds for the new fire station at a premium. We were able to raise almost \$10 million in revenues for only about \$9 million in debt. This means that our tax payers get a break. After the first five years, their tax rate drops from 61 cents per thousand to 51 cents per thousand. Please congratulate Linda Carter on her leadership in selling the bonds.

Let's all congratulate our Police and Fire Fighters for their professionalism during the Round-Up. We couldn't put on this wonderful yearly event without their help. I also noticed a lot of City employees who volunteered to help with Round-Up, Happy Canyon, and the Main Street Cowboys this year, and it is important to note that the Round-Up and Happy Canyon would not exist without the participation of so many great volunteers.

Let 'er Buck and get ready for "After Round-Up"!!

#### **Bond Measure**

The bond sale occurred last week and as I'm sure you may have heard, we received nearly 10 million dollars for only nine million. It's fairly complicated, but the bond market is very favorable right now so people were willing to pay more for the bonds than we anticipated. The bottom line is that the citizens of Pendleton will be paying much less than expected, which is fantastic and in line with our bond motto: Promises made, **promises kept.** We actually receive the money today, thus we are diligently making all the purchases that were planned with this money.

#### **Fire Station Construction:**

Work continues on the purchase of the land and land surveying. The design committee has met several times and has made some modifications to the original design. The architect is busy updating the drawings and we should be issuing a RFQ soon for the general contractor.

#### **Grants**

We are still waiting to hear the results of our applications for two federal grants under the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) as well as the SAFER grant request. We should hear in the next month or so.

#### **Community Paramedic Program**

Kristin Schmidtgall and Shawn Penninger made a presentation to City Council on a potential Community Paramedic Program. The presentation was well received by the council. Work continues behind the scenes on the potential establishment of this program by years end.



#### **PENDLETON URBAN RENEWAL**

#### Advice from Pendleton Police

With so much widespread devastation our Country has seen in recent weeks, unfortunately in the rush to provide aid, a number of scams emerged that exploit our altruistic urges.

Before you respond to the avalanche of appeals in every medium, you need to be careful.

It is important to know where your aide is going. By using organizations like GiveWell, Charity Navigator, Charity Watch, or the Better Business Bureau, you can make sure you know your money is being used to help.

How do you avoid a scam? Here are some guidelines:

\*Verify the trustworthiness of soliciting relief organizations.

\*See if the charity has on-the-ground presence in the impacted areas.

\*Find out if the charity is providing directly or raising money for other groups – avoid the middle man and give directly.

\*Be cautious about gifts of clothing, food or other in-kind donations – sometimes this is more work and not the quickest way to help those in need.

\*Don't feel pressured to give, simply tell the solicitor that you will call back after you've done your research.

# RIVER PARKWAY VOLUNTEERS CLEANUP EFFORTS MAKING DIFFERENCE

City volunteers partnered with community members and organizations at the August 5<sup>th</sup> S.U.R.E (Stewards of the Umatilla River Environment) Umatilla River clean-up event. More than 60 volunteers pitched in and cleared 480 pounds of trash from the parkway and riverbank at this annual event. According to Casey Brown, City Special Projects Coordinator, the amount of trash recovered this year was less than average. The regular volunteer cleanup by individuals and organizations that have adopted sections of the Parkway through the City's Adopt a Park/Parkway program is clearly making a difference, helping to keep our community's parks and parkways clean and safe.



# **Got a Library Card?**

**Who can get a card**: Anyone with a Pendleton address can get a free library card.



**How to Get Your Card**: Bring a piece of picture ID with your current Pendleton mailing address, and fill out our application. If your picture ID is not current, bring it and something official with your current Pendleton mailing address to fill out the application.

**Borrowing Limits**: The first time you check out, you can have 2 items. We take a day to put your information into our computer. After that, you have a limit of 50 items!

**Placing Holds**: When your application has been entered into our computer, you will be able to hold up to 9 items, from any library in the Sage system. You can even access your account online to search for and hold the items!

Renewing Your Borrowed Items: Most of our items check out for three weeks. They can be renewed for another three weeks, if no other patron is waiting to check them out. Our movies, either on video cassette or dvd check out for one week, and can be renewed for a further week. You can access your account online for renewals, or call us to renew things for you, or come in and talk to us in person (we always like that best).
