A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

HOUSING



Many of us have experienced frustration in finding a suitable place to live in Pendleton at a price we can afford. Approximately 4500 people a day commute here to work and many of them would live here if more housing was available. In fact, our major employers estimate that there are at least 300 unfilled jobs in town due to a lack of qualified workers. So, a shortage of housing probably acts as a drag on our local economy.

In July of 2016, we concluded a formal housing study that documented the need for more dwelling units and gave potential builders and landlords confidence that they could invest locally in housing and make a profit. In January of 2017, the City Council made housing one of the City's four priorities.

Let's talk about some of the actions we are taking to help provide more housing.

1. On August 30th, the City is co-hosting (with ten local co-sponsors) a large conference on Housing. This conference is designed to bring developers, builders, property owners, realtors, sub-contractors, and city officials together to discuss housing opportunities in Pendleton.
2. We are trying to reduce the number of blighted properties. Last year we received a \$400,000 Community Development Block Grant to help renovate blighted homes. We also added a half-time code enforcement officer in the 2018 budget and significantly increased our budget to abate nuisance properties
3. We have contacted several builders to provide information about housing in Pendleton. We are starting to see increased interest in building new houses, apartments, and townhouses.
4. We are researching the existing lots that are vacant to show there is an inventory of buildable properties near existing utilities that could be attractive home sites.

Many more recommendations came from the 2016 Housing study and we still have a lot of work to do. You can help by telling your contacts that Pendleton is open for business and we are encouraging builders to give us a chance to work with them!

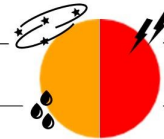

YARD SALE REMINDER



You CAN NOT place signs on streets, medians or affixed to light poles, stop

signs, utility poles, fire hydrants or on any other public property. If your sign is posted in violation it will be removed by Code Enforcement and can result in a fine of \$500. Yard sale signs may be placed in private yards with the property owner's permission. Those signs need to be removed once the sale is over. Signs that blow into roadways could become a traffic hazard for motorists.

Those who leave signs posted for longer durations can be cited for littering.
