

Working to Open Pendleton

On Tuesday, February 23rd, Umatilla County was able to move from a COVID status of "Extremely High Risk" to "High Risk", and this allowed a limited opening of indoor dining, fitness centers, and other small businesses. On Monday, March 15th, the Pendleton City Hall opened its doors after months of our employees working remotely. On the 29th of March, our K-12 students will begin to attend their classes in a hybrid pattern. The task now is to continue to reduce our test positivity rate so that we can further reduce our risk status and get to the point where we can safely hold large tourism events.



Most of you are aware of the tremendously positive impact that large tourism events have on the economy of Umatilla County. The loss of the State 2A basketball tournament (our second largest event after Round-Up) this year is significant. At the end of April, we will host the annual Cattle Baron's Weekend and I applaud the work of the CBW Board in planning a safe, responsible way to bring hundreds of people together. We all need to work together to set the conditions so our K-12 students can return to their classrooms full-time and we can hold other large annual events like Bike Week, Music Fest, and the Round-Up.

What should you do? Well, first get vaccinated when you have the opportunity. While Umatilla County Public Health has efficiently administered every dose of vaccine it has received, I have heard reports that they are seeing a slight decrease in people interested in getting the shot. Second: keep wearing a mask. We aren't sure if we can spread COVID even after being vaccinated, so mask-wearing is going to be with us for a few more months. Third: continue to keep your distance at work and in social environments. It is probably safe to socialize with friends who have received a complete vaccination but try to limit the size of your events. Finally, get tested and encourage everyone you know to get tested. Why? Because we need more negative test results to be recorded, thus driving our test positivity rating down and allowing our County COVID status to move downwards towards a safer rating that allows more events. St. Anthony Hospital has been sponsoring free mass testing events every Monday morning at the Convention Center.

We are heading in the right direction. On March 11th, St. Anthony Hospital reported that it had not had a COVID patient hospitalized for about 10 days. This is good news and we need to keep doing smart things to reinforce this trend. Get your shot, wear a mask, and keep your distance until we beat this virus back to a safer level. Getting tested will help ensure we can hold those extremely important tourism events on the schedule.

CURENT OPENINGS ON CITY BOARDS/COMMITTEES/COMMISSIONS

The City of Pendleton offers many opportunities for citizens to volunteer and serve in the community. Currently we have openings on the following committees/commissions;

HISTORICAL PRESERVATIONS COMMITTEE Is looking for applicants that have a background in history, architecture, architectural history, archaeology, or related fields or have demonstrated a POSITIVE interest, competence, or knowledge in historic preservation.

Members need to have these qualifications to maintain Certified Local Government standing with the State Historic Preservation Commission. This opens door for the City and its citizens to obtain grants, assistance, recognition, and recommendations: for example the Main Street grant.

AIRPORT COMMISSION - (Ordinance No. 2493) 11 members: no more than 5 non-residents, 3 may reside more than 20 miles from the city. 3 year terms; expiring in December of each year; 2 ex-officio members: Airport Manager & Mayor. No more than 3 expire each year.

BUDGET COMMITTEE - Provided by State law. Consists of Mayor, Council Members and 9 citizen members appointed by City Council; 3 year terms; expiring in December of each year.
