STREETS UPDATE

City Council's number one goal is to eventually have all of our streets to good condition. The major hurdle is our current levels of funding for streets do not allow for this investment – streets are very expensive to maintain – and only getting more expensive. City Council continues to explore additional funding considerations for preservation of the City's street network. Significant investment has been made recently, with about \$3.2 million invested in 2022 and \$2.4 million invested in 2021. For 2022, it is anticipated that our investment will be about \$3.7 million.

City staff use a program, Street Saver, to help determine which streets will receive treatment. These treatments consist of crack sealing, slurry sealing, overlay, and/or reconstruction. The program balances available budget and current pavement condition information to provide a list of streets and recommended treatments. City staff also assess underground city-owned utilities, and coordination with private utilities, as part of the consideration. This information is combined in recommending project award consideration to City Council.

Specific to the Urban Renewal District (URD), state law only allows URD funds to be used for street reconstruction or new construction. City staff used pavement condition information to determine which streets in the URD were eligible for reconstruction. Staff has made recommendations to the Pendleton Development Commission (PDC) on which streets are eligible for reconstruction. City has been reconstructing streets within the URD the last several years and have more to complete in the future as URD funding allows.

Here's a summary of our street projects for the 2022 construction season:

Slurry Seal Project: awarded at about \$362,580 to Doolittle Construction LLC with completion targeted for the end of August 2022 (before school starts). Slurry seal is an application of oil and fine rock mix used to refresh the surface of the pavement. Projects underway include:

Overlays include a new layer of asphalt pavement and reconstruction includes removal and new supporting base rock and asphalt pavement. Projects underway include:

SW 37th Overlay (Southgate Place to SW Jay Ave);

SE Court Place Overlay and Reconstruction (SE 11th to SE 14th);

SW 28th Drive Reconstruction (SW 30th to SW Goodwin);

SW Nye Reconstruction (SW 2nd to SE 3rd);

SE Goodwin Overlay (S Main to PCC);

NW Ellis Overlay (NW 8th to NW 11th); and

NW 14th Overlay (NW Carden to NW Despain).


URBAN RENEWAL: 2022 RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT: out to bid with an estimated cost of about \$2,054,000. Bid recommendation will be considered by Pendleton Development Commission (PDC) on Tuesday, June 21, 2022. Reconstruction work will include:

SE Byers (SW 1st to SE 7th);

SE 4th (Byers to Court); and

SW 10th (Dorion to Emigrant).

Due to supply chain issues for replacement of underground utilities, City and PDC have delayed two large street projects for the 2023 construction season: \$1.95 million for NW Despain (Main Street Bridge to NW 7th), Main Street Bridge overlay, and potential treatment on N Main; and \$1.5 million for reconstruction of SE 3rd (Frazer to Byers).

Food will be available for purchase or you can bring your own picnic lunch.


