A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF HOW THE PARKS AND RECREATION SERVICES THE CITY OF PENDLETON.

The Parks Division currently maintains approximately 22 parks and 17 landscaped areas, ranging from the City Hall complex to the "Cattle Drive" freeway interchange. To break this task into manageable portions, we have divided the City into 5 zones. Each zone has one full time Utility worker who is responsible for the overall maintenance of that list of parks and facilities. They are assisted by 1-2 seasonal or part time laborers during the warmer months.

For example, zone two encompasses the following downtown parks and landscaped areas: City Hall, Frasier Triangle, Museum Park, May Park, Til Taylor Park, Kiwanis Park, Stillman Park, Eastgate Memorial, Centennial Park, Brownfield Park, Riverfront Plaza, and the traffic islands outside Dairy Queen.

Providing no issues arise, the first 3 days of the week are spent mowing and edging all the areas. Leaving the last two days to focus on more intensive maintenance such as weeding, pruning, herbicide application, irrigation adjustment, and playground maintenance at a couple of selected sites.

Frequently, things come up that derail this planned schedule. Obviously public safety is our number one priority, so vandalism, broken play equipment, illegal camp cleanups, and irrigation breaks often require us to modify the planned work for the week. Full body funerals also often require more staff than those that are permanently assigned to the cemetery, so work on other areas has to be delayed so that we can provide that service.

All in all, there is always more work to do that we are able to accomplish in any given week, so a large part of the Parks Supervisor's responsibility is taking the list of tasks and deciding which are the most crucial to the community to accomplish right away, and what must be deferred to a later date.

The Recreation Division operates a wide variety of programs from the afterschool program to youth basketball. The afterschool program operates at the three elementary schools and has 2-3 staff at each site. Programs like youth basketball operate largely on volunteers, with 1-2 volunteer coaches per team. In addition to programs, the Recreation Division also operates facilities where a drop in or rental fee is charged, this would include the Pendleton Family Aquatic Center, the Recreation Center and the Ice Skating Rink. We have one recreation supervisor who manages the Recreation Center and youth recreation programs. The other recreation supervisor manages the Aquatic Center, the Ice Skating Rink, and adult sports and leagues.

The department has 1 Office Specialist, and 1 Communication Coordinator who together staff the departments front office, taking calls for everything from T-Ball signups to funeral arrangements, and with over 500 enrolments in swimming lessons alone, it is easy to imagine the office can become extremely busy at times. The Aquatic Center alone employs over 50 staff each summer, which pushes the total number of people employed by the Parks and Recreation Department to over 90 in the middle of summer, and total well over 100 in the course of an average year. With many of these seasonal staff being high school or college students, our 3 division supervisors spend a huge amount of their time hiring and training staff. One of the greatest challenges the Parks and Recreation Department faces in achieving the goal of continuing to increase revenue production is how to scale our operation to handle the increased volume.

Gravel pick-up will begin in the McKay area starting at Southgate PI and SW 37th St., moving to south and west to SW 45th St area.

Following McKay area, work will move to Sherwood area and SW Hailey Ave.

As work progresses, City crews will be setting out yellow signs with red lettering for the areas being targeted. These signs indicate sweeping is being done in the area and, if possible, to park your vehicles off-street to allow the gravel to be picked-up. If you have to stay parked on the street and the sweeper has passed through your area, park in a swept area in preparation for our regular sweeping schedule.

It typically takes between 8 to 12 weeks to vacuum sweep all the streets, then repeats.

WHEN DO YOU NEED A RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURAL PERMIT?

A permit is required to construct, enlarge, alter, move, or replace any home or related structure. For example, a permit is required to:

- Add a room.
- Build or alter a carport, garage, or shed of more than 200 square feet.
- Build or alter a carport, garage, or shed of less than 200 square feet if the height exceeds 10 feet from the finished floor to average height of the roof surface.
- Finish an attic, garage, or basement to make additional living space.
- Cut a new window or door opening or widen existing openings.
- Add, move, or remove walls.
- Apply roofing when all of the old roofing is removed and new sheathing/ sub roof is installed.
- Reroof in wildfire hazard zones.
- Build a stairway.
- Build a retaining wall that supports or protects a building.
- Build or replace a deck more than 30 inches above adjacent grade measured at any point within three feet horizontally of the deck.
- Install a fence to serve as a barrier around a swimming pool, hot tub, or spa.

Please submit your drawings, site plan and truss designs in digital format (on a flash drive), professional or otherwise unless otherwise approved by the Building Official. Plan Review Fee is required upon submission of plans. You may call us for estimated fees. Building fees do not incorporate fees for other departments or permits. Our office reviews plans on a first come, first serve basis.

ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN







The above spreadsheet explains our season pass pricing. We have multiple options available from individual passes to family passes. The family pass option is intended and verified for members of your household and is a great way to save on your season pass. For example, if you were to purchase two adult passes and three youth season passes, it would cost \$330. A family pass with one adult account holder and 4 additional family members would save you \$150. If your family of 5 frequents the pool, purchasing a family pass instead of paying general admission saves you \$90 after just 10 visits.
