But the beauty of democracy in America is that the vast majority of Americans will peacefully accept the results of the election and work within the system to try to effect change in a peaceful and legal manner.

For our local and regional candidates, congratulations to those who won. For those who lost, please accept our thanks for having the courage to throw yourself into the election arena and compete. The City of Pendleton has a long-standing positive partnership with the County Commission and I expect that productive relationship to continue under Commissioners Shafer, Timmons, and Dorran. We profusely thank Commissioner George Murdock for his effective leadership over the past eight years. The City Council welcomes Addison Schulberg, a hard-working local restaurant owner to the Council while we say goodbye to our good friend and Pendleton Man of the Year Jake Cambier. The newly elected candidates will take office at the beginning of 2023.

2022 was a good year for Pendleton as we made excellent progress in building housing, fixing infrastructure, growing our local economy, expanding the UAS test range, and renovating parts of our downtown core. There is much to be done in 2023. Last month, I talked about the coming Legislative Session, where Pendleton has major funding requests for a new arterial road that will allow us to continue building more housing, and for a new Child Care Center. We expect the Legislature to work hard on building more housing, fixing the flaws in Measure 110, and addressing the homeless issue in Oregon.

### “Do You Know About A Pendleton’s Transit Services Available to Seniors and People with Disabilities?”

If you’re a senior or person with disability looking for an affordable, convenient ride, then our taxi ticket voucher program is just for you! This program provides rides to citizens 60+ and people with disabilities that live within the City’s limits and 7 driving miles outside of Pendleton and do not live within another transit provider’s boundary. This program provides rides 7 days a week between 5 AM - 10 PM, except on holidays. Participants pay \$2.00 for a one-way ride. 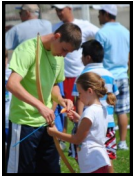
