

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2023

We have seen a number of great projects in Pendleton in recent years, including a new fire station, a new cancer center, a new State Police crime lab, the completion of the SE 8th Street bridge and the rebuilding of SE Byers. We have a new industrial park, hotel, and hangars at the airport. The Til Taylor Park renovation included a splash pad, two playgrounds, and a dog park. We have been repairing streets at a faster pace than anyone can remember, and in 2022 we opened 80 units of



affordable housing at the Wildflower complex next to Olney Cemetery. A group of private citizens were responsible for opening a new child care center that is expected to expand in 2023.

More new projects are coming to town in 2023. Here is what we are working on and we expect to see:

- Completion of the new pump station and water reservoir by the airport.
- Construction of a pump station and phase I of an arterial road on the Goad/ Rees property in eastern Pendleton. This is the first step in opening approximately 250 acres that can be used for new housing.
- There will be more new housing starts north of the Middle School and on SW 18th Street.
- Annexation of 50 acres into the current UGB.
- Finishing the renovation of the terminal building at the airport.
- Robust street reconstruction in both the downtown area and in residential areas.
- Seventy more units of affordable housing being built in eastern Pendleton. This is the South Hill Commons project sponsored by the Horizon Project.
- Construction will begin on BMCC's FARM II facility on the Round-Up campus, beginning shortly after the Round-Up in September.
- We should complete a formal basin analysis of McKay Creek and McKay Reservoir that will produce ideas on how to alleviate the high water incidents we seem to have every year below the dam.
- The Police Department plans to add at least one more officer to our force.
- The Fire Department will add a new ladder truck to its fleet.
- We will begin construction on a new city bus barn near the airport, which is almost entirely funded by the State Department of Transportation.

These projects sometimes take longer than we want to reach completion, but they are all currently in the works. In addition, Pendleton is making progress on gradually renovating the Vert Auditorium and increasing the efficiency of our communications with the public. You can be assured that the City is looking hard at the recent infrastructure and authorization bills passed by the US Congress to see what new sources of money may apply to us. We are also working closely with our elected State officials. The year 2023 should be a good one!

We understand the interest by our citizens to better understand the work being accomplished and planned by the City of Pendleton," said Bob Patterson, Public Works Director. "Quite a bit of work went into delivering this information and will continue to go into keeping it updated. Also, outside developers are very interested in understanding the investments being made in our community as they consider development opportunities in Pendleton."

<u>PendletonProjects.com</u> includes information about the scope, cost and purpose of construction activities across the City of Pendleton, from the airport to urban renewal. Site visitors can sort projects by category – street, water, wastewater, facilities, parks or urban renewal – or status – in progress, planned or completed. Completed projects can also be examined by

year, and an interactive projects map allows users to visually track projects in each category.



At launch, the site includes more than 50 projects, but it is a work in progress that will be updated regularly to include new projects.

Pendleton Projects aligns with the Pendleton City Council goals to improve communication and also helps meet the needs of the community, as identified in the 2022 City Communications Survey. In that survey, participants identified construction as the No. 1 priority area for city communications.


Allow extra time to get to the destination.

Utility Worker

City of Pendleton Parks, Recreation, and Cemetery Department

The City of Pendleton Park and Recreation Department is seeking enthusiastic, high-energy candidates to fill a Utility Worker Position within the Parks Department. The salary range for the position is \$43,212-\$58,164 annually with excellent benefits.

Position Summary

Utility Workers within the Parks and Recreation Department are responsible for serving the citizens and visitors of the City of Pendleton by performing a wide range of maintenance and construction tasks in the parks and cemetery including but not limited to: Mowing, weeding, herbicide application, landscaping, tree trimming, irrigation repair, equipment maintenance, excavation, funeral services, repairing restrooms, graffiti removal and painting. Utility Worker's primary responsibility is managing all parks maintenance activities within an assigned zone. Zones generally encompass multiple parks and public landscaped areas. The right candidate will be someone who takes ownership over his or her assigned area and takes pride in making it the best experience for the public possible. Due to the size of the parks system in Pendleton, supervisors are unable to inspect every park every week, therefore the right candidate will be someone who is self-motivated and can independently identify and correct issues as part of their regular maintenance route.



What does a normal day look like working on the parks crew?

- Days start early. Depending on the time of year, the crew starts between 6am and 7am, end at 2:30 pm or 3:30 pm, with a 30 minute lunch and two 15 minute breaks.
- During the mowing season, the mornings generally start with daily mower maintenance and equipment preparation.
- Staff then head out into the field and depending on the zone, the Utility Worker may be accompanied by one or two seasonal laborers.
- At each park, the Utility Worker is responsible for mowing grass, edging walkways, pruning and weeding landscaped areas, spot spraying weeds, raking playground woodchips, trash removal, graffiti cleanup, and addressing any unexpected issues to ensure the park is always attractive, clean, and safe for residents and visitors of Pendleton. The spring and summer seasons often require long, strenuous days in hot weather.
- The fall season focuses mainly on leaf removal and mulching, as well as general maintenance tasks.
- The winter season includes snow removal on pathways in parks and facilities. This sometimes requires coming in earlier than regularly scheduled and performing physically demanding work in cold weather. Winter also includes big maintenance projects such as refurbishing bathrooms and an overhaul of equipment.

 Generally, one Utility Worker's primary function is Cemetery maintenance and services, however, it is expected that all Parks Utility Workers become proficient in Cemetery Operations, including digging of graves and performing burials.

- Training will be provided, prior cemetery experience is a bonus but not required.
- Throughout the year the Parks crew have the responsibility to maintain public spaces in a clean sanitary condition, this includes regular trash pickup, urban camp cleanup, and removal of illegally dumped items.
- All year long Utility Workers are Part of the larger Park and Recreation
 Department team. Sometimes if another division needs help, Utility Workers
 may assist with a recreation event for example, especially in the physical setup
 and takedown portions.

Position Summary

Utility Workers within the Public Works Department are responsible for serving the City of Pendleton by performing a wide range of maintenance and construction tasks related to water supply facilities, booster stations, reservoirs, valves, hydrants, and water meters.
