

# PENDLETON Working every day to be the premier city in Eastern Oregon

## IT IS BUDGET SEASON

Most local governments in Oregon have to adopt a budget by the end of June per State of Oregon budget law. Oregon operates on a fiscal year that runs July through June. Local governments generally build their budgets in the early spring and then have their budget committees approve them in late April or early May. On 14 May, the City of Pendleton's budget committee approved its budget for fiscal year 2025, which begins on 1 July. This budget will now go the City Council in June for adoption. What is in it?

Most public budgets have a General Fund and several different "Special Revenue" funds (in which I will lump together for the sake of simplicity, our other funds for debt service, capital projects, enterprises, internal service, and agencies), These "special funds" can only be used for their specific purposes. For FY 25, Pendleton's total budget is just under \$110 million and the General Fund is just under \$22 million.



The General Fund pays for the city's operations. It pays for police, fire, parks, recreation, the Municipal Court, the cemetery, the Aquatic Center, and the Planning/ Community Development department. About 39% of the revenues in the General Fund come from taxes and special assessments. Other major sources of revenues are licenses and permits, intergovernmental transfers, and charges for services. Police and Fire departments account for the largest expenditures, with each costing about \$7 million, or nearly 60% of the General Fund.

We have 21 Special Revenue Funds, and I will only talk about a few of the larger funds. A big chunk of our street maintenance budget comes from state revenues, and I am pleased to note that we are projected to spend nearly \$4 million on street maintenance and renovation in FY 25. Our library gets much of its funding through the Umatilla County Special Library District, and so it is an example of a special fund. The city transportation program, the Convention Center, the new Center for Innovation Excellence, the system development fees fund, and the Parks Trust Fund are other examples of Special Revenue Funds.

Other important funds are for debt service (our general obligation bond for the new fire station is the only line item here), a capital projects fund, and enterprise funds that keep our water, sewers and airport in good repair.

I believe it is important to note that Pendleton has a healthy budget for the coming fiscal year, and, unlike many other cities in Oregon, we are not cutting services to balance the budget. At a time when the cost of doing business, from salaries, street repairs, building maintenance, and supplies is going through the roof, Pendleton is coping and prospering.

The election is coming very soon. Exercise your right to vote!

## **Goat Watch 2024**

The calendar has turned to May, and we're getting questions about when the goats will be out on the River Walk.

Since 2012, the City has contracted to bring in prescriptive livestock – in this case, goats – to cut down unwanted vegetation on city-owned properties that are difficult to maintain. Prescriptive grazing helps to reduce fuel loads and open up views of the Umatilla River. Grazing also provides better ability to inspect the levee, storm water outfalls and overall conditions of storm drainage.

Although the goats have arrived in Pendleton, they are not yet easily accessible for viewing. We will begin our regular "Goat Watch" posts once the goats arrive along the Umatilla River Parkway (the levee/river walk). Watch Facebook for our Goat Watch graphic to know when and where the goats are each week during grazing season.

If you do go out to view the goats in other areas, please remember to view the animals from afar and without trespassing. The fence around the goats is electrified, and the guard dogs aren't fond of people getting to close to the fence. We know the goats are cute, but they are livestock, not pets! Please keep your distance.

## Christian Science Building survey now open


Survey available online or in print form



#### **PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE SPECIALIST**

The City of Pendleton is accepting applications for a full-time Office Specialist 3 position in the Public Works Department. The position performs secretarial administrative assistance for the Public Works and Community Development Departments. Duties include: preparing bid documents for public works projects, composing letters and compiling reports requiring comprehensive knowledge of departmental policies and functions and state public bidding requirements/laws; maintaining various departmental records and monthly reports; related work as required. Requires skill in office administration and organization, as well as oral and written communication skills and computer proficiency. Requires High School Diploma or GED and at least 1 – 3 years of office experience. An Associate Degree or a Business College certificate in a related field is preferred, or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

The salary range is \$4,037-4,968/month plus excellent benefits. Open until filled.

#### LABORATORY TECHNICIAN

The City of Pendleton is seeking to fill a Laboratory Technician position at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). Duties include: Performing laboratory tests of the WWTP; collecting samples either manually or by programming equipment for automated sample collection; testing for biological and/or physical characteristics; calibrating and maintaining laboratory and process equipment; and conducting laboratory testing for other local municipalities. Must be able to obtain within 2 years a Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Wastewater Treatment Level 1 certification.

Pay is \$4,296 - \$5,290 DOQ plus benefits. Open until filled with first review May 31, 2024.

#### **ARBORIST**

The City of Pendleton is accepting applications for a USDA Grant Funded Full-Time Arborist position in the Parks and Recreation Department. The Arborist is responsible for performing a wide range of duties related to the maintenance of publicly owned or regulated trees within the City. The ideal candidate will have a strong background in arboriculture, horticulture, or forestry. This position will be required to either have or be able to obtain, within 6 months of hire, a Tree Climbing Certification. The position will be primarily Monday-Friday 7:00 am-3:30 pm but may be subject to emergency call out.

The wage range is \$4,572 - \$6,193 per month DOE plus excellent benefits. Requires valid driver's license and ability to pass a criminal background check. The position is open until filled.

### **ARBOR TECH**

The City of Pendleton is accepting applications for a USDA Grant Funded Full-Time Arbor Tech position in the Parks and Recreation Department. The Arbor Tech is responsible for providing assistance to the Arborist, and, as a team, they will perform a wide range of duties related to the maintenance of publicly owned or regulated trees within the City. The ideal candidate will have a strong background in arboriculture, horticulture, or forestry. This position will be required to either have or be able to obtain, within 6 months of hire, a Tree Climbing Certification.

The wage range is \$3,691 - \$4,522 per month DOE plus excellent benefits. Requires valid driver's license and ability to pass a criminal background check. The position is open until filled.



#### SUMMER SEASONAL POSITIONS IN THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The City is accepting applications for several seasonal positions in the Parks and Recreation Department. All wage ranges are dependent on experience (DOE) and/or certificates held. All positions require the ability to pass a criminal background check.

- <u>SUMMER CAMP RECREATION LEAD</u> With the direction of the Recreation Supervisor and Coordinator you will lead summer adventure camp, Movies in the Park, youth sports and other recreation programs. Leads will be the point of contact with program participants and their families. Must have CPR/First Aid certification or ability to obtain one. Wage \$15.50-\$17.95 per hr.
- <u>SUMMER CAMP RECREATION AIDE</u> Assist the Leads with facilitation of Summer Camp, student enrichment programs, youth sports, movies in the parks, and other recreation programs. Must have CPR/First Aid certification or ability to obtain one. Experience working with youth preferred. Wage \$13.70-\$15.41 per hr.
- <u>SEASONAL LABORER</u> Positions perform labor required to landscape and maintain parks and cemetery grounds including cultivation and care of shrubs, trees, flowers, and lawn turf, control of weeds, mowing, irrigation, waste disposal, and maintaining restrooms, shelters, and other park facilities. Wage ranges from \$14.20 \$16.95 per hour.
- <u>LIFEGUARD</u> Position requires: Current Red Cross Lifeguard Training, Standard First Aid, AED, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, or equivalent training as recognized by the American Red Cross or State. Must be at least 15 years of age. Wage \$13.20-\$14.20 per hr.
- <u>SWIM INSTRUCTOR/LIFEGUARD</u> Requirements same as above plus must have Water Safety Instructor certification. Must be at least 16 years of age. Wage \$13.20-\$15.20 per hr.
- <u>SWIM INSTRUCTOR AIDE</u> Position requires: Current Red Cross Lifeguard Training, Standard First Aid, AED, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, or equivalent training as recognized by the American Red Cross or State. Must be at least 14 years of age. Wage \$13.20-\$13.95 per hr.

## PART-TIME JANITORIAL POSITION AT THE PENDLETON CONVENTION CENTER

The City of Pendleton is accepting applications for a Part-Time Janitorial position at the Pendleton Convention Center. The primary function of this position is daily janitorial cleaning in the Convention Center or Vert Auditorium. Common duties include: cleaning restrooms, cleaning floors and other surfaces, and other basic janitorial duties as assigned.
