<p>How Are Volunteers Making An Impact?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 student interns volunteered 840 summer hours at the UAS Range • Holiday decorations were installed with the help of 6 local businesses and organizations • The 1st Annual Beer Fest, raising funds for the Afterschool Program, was supported by 40 volunteers • During the winter months 3 volunteers oversaw the Walking for Wellness program • 4 Youth Basketball programs were run by 26 Volunteer Basketball Coaches, and the PHS basketball team assisted with a Basketball Camp • A free holiday movie for the community was presented with the assistance of 5 volunteers • City Parks and Parkways have been adopted by 11 volunteers and volunteer groups to keep them litter free • Volunteers committed 43 hours maintaining the Little Re(a)d Bookshelf program, providing books at 9 locations around the community • The Police Department had 236 hours of clerical support from 2 volunteers during this period • 84 volunteers performed 156 hours of service to provide a safe and fun Halloween Carnival for the community • The Fire Station's community Open House had the help of 4 volunteers • The Library was assisted by 25 volunteers providing check-in, materials processing, community programs, shelving, and special projects for a total of 1,1675 hours • Roy Raley Ice Rink had 110.5 hours of rink and equipment maintenance assistance from volunteers • 3 volunteers committed 142 hours to offer Open Gym for community members. A Special Needs Open Gym was run by 2 volunteers • 114 hours from 28 volunteers were spent sprucing up Olney Cemetery in advance of Veterans Day • Indoor Soccer and Flag Football for youth were coached by 8 volunteers
