### Bid

Bid Award: NW Despain Avenue Reconstruction & Waterline: Council awarded the bid for reconstruction of NW Despian from Main Street to NW 7th Street to low bidder Bolen Construction LLC, of Hermiston, for \$1.13 million. This reconstruction follows the "Option 3" approved by City Counil in April 2023 and will not include any widening of the street. Parking will remain on the south side of the street, but no parking will be added on the north side. Two individuals, Mike Navratil and Mike Collins, spoke out against the inclusion of bulb outs on the south side of the street, and City Engineer Tim Simons said the bulb outs will not go into the travel lane but are for safety of pedestrians and visibility for drivers.

### New Business

- **Resolution 2932, a resolution to support EOCI inmate field trips:** *This authorizes supervised Field Training of specific inmates outside the EOCI facility.*
- Approval of SDWSRF Loan S17018 Amendment Number 4: This extends the timeline for the agreement to Oct 30, 2024.
- Request for Approval of Joseph Wyno's Contract to be Oregon UAS CIE Executive Director: *Six individuals applied, and Wyno was selected as the most qualified for the launch and management of the Oregon UAS Accelerator.*
- **W** Task Order 29: Consor: WFP Clearwell Coatings: *This will allow for repairs to the interior lining in the Water Filtration Plant steel reservoir*
