



 Executive session: The council met in a closed-door session to evaludate the city manager performance. No action was taken

Bids

\$1.07 million bid for SW Houtama Road Water Line construction project to Silver Creek Contracting, LLC, of Heppner: This bid is part of a larger project which includes the installation of this waterline and the construction of a new pump station in the near future

New Business:

Resolution 2871 Authorizing Receipt of Opioid Litigation Settlement Funds: The City of Pendleton is part of a lawsuit against those that made or distributed opioids, and the City's portion of the pending settlement is estimated at about \$500,000, paid in annual increments over 18 years Those funds will be used to address and alleviate effects of opioid addiction.

Airport purchase of front loader: Authorizes \$450,274 of CARES Act funds for purchase of a new John Deere 744L Wheel Loader to help with snow removal.

Airport Access Road Paving: Authorizes \$125,000 of CARES Act funds to pave a portion of the outer airport access road for use by UAS customers. This access road is the old WWII taxi lane that connected the B-17 bomber pads to the ramp and runways.
