**Community Discussion:** Multiple community members approached council about creating a committee to address homelessness and associated issues in the City of Pendleton, especially for businesses. Mayor John Turner asked the City Manager to set an initial meeting with the community members to discuss what the committee might look like.

## Bid Award:

Creative Bus Sales: ADA wheelchair accessible van for the Transportation program, funded through ODOT grant

SW 10th Street Award funding consideration: Staff asked City Council to approve use of Sewer Fund enterprise funds for payment of sewer related unit price bid items for the Urban Renewal District's SW 10th Reconstruction Project

MWA Architects: Second phase of design and construction support for the Bus Barn Transit Facility Project

Murraysmith: Task Order for water transmission main design at the East End Booster Pump Station and the High Level Pump Station

## New Business:

Ordinance 3990 Declaring a Ban on Psilocybin Services in Pendleton: In November 2020, Oregon voters approved Ballot Measure 109, known as the Oregon Psilocybin Service Act (codified at ORS 475A), which allows for the manufacture, delivery and administration of psilocybin at licensed facilities. This ordinance prepares for Resolution 2885, slated for the next meeting, that would allow voters in the November election to decide whether the City of Pendleton bans psilocybin services.

LOC Legislative Priorities: The League of Oregon Cities provided a list of priorities going into the 2023 legislative session. Cities are asked to submit a vote on those subjects they feel should constitute the legislative priority for the association.
