

Community Discussion:

- Cheri Kendrick, Karl Davis, and Nika Blasser each spoke about Pendleton Cultural Foundation's exchange program with sister city Minamisoma, Japan. Japanese exchange students Mizuki, Miku, Toshinori, Rin, Yuka, and Hiyori each introduced themselves to the council, and chaperone Yukari Tadano spoke with the council about the visit.
- Jorge Morfin spoke about concern with theft crimes and asked why the city does not have cameras around town to record crimes. City Manager Robb Corbett said maintaining that kind of security camera network is cost prohibitive.

Consent Agenda: The consent agenda groups routine meeting actions into a single agenda item so they can be approved in one step, rather than in multiple motions.

New blower at Waste Water Treatment Resource Recovery Facility Award: Low-bidder Aerzen USA Corp will be paid \$55,015 for a new blower at the WWTRRF.

✓ Clarifier Coatings Award: Low-bidder Extreme Coatings will be paid \$66,819 to coat the West Primary Clarifier at the WWTRRF to protect it from erosion and acid attach that happens in wastewater environments.

SE 3rd St Reconstruction Project – Water Fund Share for Project: Transfer of up to \$104,000 from the water fund to pay the Pendleton Development Commission Contractor for half the total asphalt cost for the SE 3rd Street Reconstruction Project. The PDC will pay the other half of construction costs.



Bids

M Award PO for Materials for NE Ellis PI water main project: Purchase order for materials for the NE Ellis Place Water Main Project to Consolidated Supply of Hermiston for \$65,699

New Business:

✓ Capitol Asset & Pavement Services, from Silverton, Oregon, to update our pavement condition database: This action allows city staff to negotiate with CAPS to update the pavement condition database. Having our pavement condition index database updated is part of our long-term pavement management plan, with this effort typically being done about every 5-years. The last time an assessment was done was in 2018. CAPS completed the assessments in both 2013 and 2018.

Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA): No. 73000-00012065: Pendleton Signal Upgrade Project Phase II: This agreement addresses several concerts about traffic signal upgrades in town before the next phase begins later this year. Phase II targets the intersection of SW First and SW Dorion and will include replacing the existing signal, removing the existing turn lane for mail drop boxes, installing improved ADA curb ramps, and improving storm drainage. The IGA includes updates on controller cabinets, sidewalks, and vinyl wraps on selected controller cabinets.
