Bids:

 *Pendleton Family Aquatic Center Leak Repair: City awarded a bid of up to \$150,000 to Anderson Pool Works to repair a leak that exists in the piping under the leisure pool. The project should be completed before the 2023 pool season.*

New Business:

 *Purchase approval of three 2023 Ford SUV police vehicles: Due to the impacts that the COVID-19 pandemic had on supply chain issues, the Pendleton Police Department was not able to purchase any new police vehicles in the 2021-2022 fiscal year. This fiscal year, 2022-2023, the Pendleton Police Department has been authorized \$190,000 in total funds to purchase three new police cars and have them outfitted.*

 *Declare Real Property Surplus and Request for Approval to Sell Surplus 3.85 acres to Bill Cole: Council opened a public hearing to declare 3.85 acres on the east side of Airport Road as surplus property with the intent to sell to Bill Cole for \$100,000 for construction of a new storage business. Bill Cole was the only individual to speak during the public hearing. Both the surplus declaration and the sale were approved unanimously.*
