



Minutes of the Nov. 15, 2022, meeting; liquor license for Pendleton Fuel & Go
LLC; executive session pursuant to ORS 192.660(2)(e) real property; confirmation
of Erin Biencourt to the Library Board;

Public Hearing:

Ordinance 3992, amending Ordinance 2795, the Room Tax Ordinance: In 2020, the Oregon Department of Revenue began collecting local room taxes for local governments; after a year of DOR's collection service, staff has concluded it is not working well for the city and the city should resume its own local room tax administration. At the request of Travel Pendleton, this ordinance ALSO increases the amount for paid spaces in campsites and mobile home parks from \$0.50 per night to \$2 per night and the amount for lodging from \$1.50 per night to \$4 per night. It also changes the allocation of the funds; under the new ordinance, funding is split 70% (was 55%) to the Pendleton Chamber and 30% (was 45%) to the Pendleton Convention Center.

New Business:

First reading of Ordinance 3993, amending Ordinance 3471, the Business License Ordinance: This ordinance amendment will clarify the business license ordinance. Ordinance 3993 addresses revision of general organization, including clarifying exceptions.

Ambulance Purchase Authorization: Authorized the purchase of one new ambulance for \$264,213. This ambulance will replace the Fire Department's oldest ambulance, purchased in 2015.

Water CIP Annual Report: Public Works Director Bob
Patterson updated the council on progress toward
accomplishing goals from the Water Capital Improvement
Plan.
